

## Interview with Rith Linda

Rith Linda is from a small village in Kampong Cham Province. She came to NFC in December 2004. Since she arrived at NFC, she has made a great effort to use the opportunities to seek a new future at NFC. In

three years time she passed 12 levels of English and graduated from the highest level of English at New World Institute, which is recognized as one of the best English schools in Phnom Penh. She is currently continuing English studies in the 3-hrs./day NFC English program.

She also has learned computer skills through the NFC computer class, studied traditional Khmer dance and performs often.



During a workshop on the topic, "Future Plans" (organized by NFC), she decided to pursue her dream and work to prepare to study medicine. Studying medical subjects in Cambodia requires knowledge of French, so she has joined a French class taught by a volunteer at NFC.

She is currently preparing to graduate from high school in July

2011. Her first semester of medicine starts in October. Linda says that, "I can give back to NFC by studying hard and encouraging the young children to understand that they have to do the same thing to get a new future in Cambodia". After finishing her studies, one of her dreams is to gain experience in medicine working in Vietnam because she has heard that she can learn a lot more at the advanced medical facilities there. After working in medicine Vietnam and Cambodia, she wants to open her own clinic in Phnom Penh. To give back to NFC, she wants to use her knowledge and skills to help children here with free treatment and medicine.

#### Hean's Story

Before NFC, I was living with my mother. It was really difficult for her to earn enough money to feed us and support us to go to school. She earned only \$2.50 per day. We have a big family with 4 brothers, 1 sister but no father, so my mom was the only one to pay for all of us to go to public school (Khmer). I wanted to study



English and I asked her to go to an English school with me to enroll me. I knew that she really wanted me to study there, but she didn't have enough money to afford to send me there. She just bought me a basic book on English with Khmer so I can learn myself.



A few years later when money was very difficult for her to earn and she was worried about our welfare, she heard about NFC being a place for orphaned and vulnerable children. I was 9 years old and very small for my age. She was worried about my health and told me I could learn English at NFC as well. She felt this would be the best place for me. At first I really missed everyone at home, but

after a while I made friends and started to enjoy learning English. Later on I had an opportunity to learn computer skills through class material provided by Kamonohashi Computer Center and a class at NFC taught by a full time volunteer, Chris Merritt.

I think I am a new person with a new future compared to the past. I am healthy. I have a chance to complete my general education as well as learn English and computer skills. I have learned and been paid to design websites and to provide computer technical support to another orphanage. I started a small business selling items made by NFC children in England. The business also provides money to the NFC children who make the items and 20% goes to New Future for Children. These are ways that NFC has helped me and I now help NFC towards a new future.
