Hun attended Khmer traditional Dance and Music classes at NFC. In 2008 Hun joined break dance training provided by Tinytoones and excelled at it. Later he taught break dance lessons as a part time job and continued training the break dance students at NFC.

Donations from Tony Sparrow's Cross Country Biking Tour



Vitchheang places 5th for UWC Scholarship

After three exams followed by doing a live presentation, **Thy Vitchheang** placed 5th out of the 89 entrants for a scholarship to a United World College (UWC) in a foreign country (there is no UWC in Cambodia). This meant he had the opportunity to accept a partial scholarship that would cover 25% of the enrollment and living expenses for a two year program. This is quite an achievement!

His original plan was to run a marathon but an ankle injury precluded that choice, so a friend suggested he do a swimathon instead.




Dr. Richard Wagner -Surgery for Sor Pech, Lo Rotha
